2012 SPRING SEEDLING SALE

Following is a brief description of the seedlings and items offered in our Spring Seedling Sale. We appreciate your patronage and support of this and other environmental programs. If you have any questions, please call 836-2589. Thank you!

EVERGREENS

Colorado Blue Spruce - 8 to 18" seedlings can grow to 100' and should reach 6' in 8 or 9 years in ordinary soil with average moisture. Short silver-blue needles, a favorite for Christmas trees, ornamentals or windbreaks.



Norway Spruce - 10 to 22" fast growing seedlings reach 6' in 6 to 7 years in ordinary soil. Short, shiny, dark green needles. Appealing ornamental, windbreak, good for timber. Needs moisture to retain dark color.

Scotch Pine - 9 to 18" seedlings. A medium sized tree growing 50 to 60 foot tall. Preferred strain for Christmas trees. Best winter color of all. Prefers moist, well-drained soils, but will tolerate drier sites.



Douglas Fir - 10 to 20" seedlings grow fast in light, well-drained soil and full sun. Short, soft blue-green needles make a fine Christmas tree. America's largest timber producer.

Eastern White Pine - 7 to 14" seedlings. Very fast growth. Long, soft blue-green needles. Hardy in all soils, tolerates swampy areas. Can be pruned as hedge, good for windbreak, timber and re-forestation.



HARDWOODS



Red Oak - 6 to 12" seedlings matures to 75' in all soil conditions. Fastest growing of all oaks. A "city tree" that tolerates salt, ozone, and sulphur dioxide.

Sugar Maple - 18 to 24" seedlings grow to 75' in well-drained soil. Our native, syrup producer, highly-valued furniture wood. Brilliant scarlet/orange foliage in autumn.



Red Maple - 8 to 16" seedlings. Grow to 40'-60'. Highly prized because of red flowers in spring. Native to PA.

Black Cherry - 8 to 16" seedlings grow to 80' in all soils except very wet or very dry. Abundant small, white flowers produce small, dark, slightly bitter cherries. A very valuable timber tree, dark green foliage turns yellow or red in fall.



Pin Oak - 6 to 10" seedlings grow quickly to 75', produces acorns for wildlife. Graceful pyramid shape, good for windbreaks. Holds red/russet leaves until spring. Native to PA.

RHUBARB

Crimson Red - Upright growing plant with large, tender stalks and a bright red color. Resistance to root rot problems.



TUBEX

Four foot tree shelters increase survival rate and growth. Protects young trees from deer, rabbits and weed wackers. No stakes. Not recommended for evergreens.

APPLE TREES

4' to 6' two-year un-pruned.

Most require two different varieties for proper pollination.

Honeycrisp Apple - 1/2 to 5/8" diameter trunk. Crisp and juicy texture, tender all-purpose quality fruit ripens late September early October and stores very well. Grows well on hillsides. Blooms early to midseason.



Redcort Apple - 5/8 to 3/4' diameter trunk. All purpose apple with sweet flesh with a hint of tartness. Good for eating off the tree with bright white flesh or baking. Sliced pieces resist browning.

BLUEBERRY BUSHES (12" to 18")

Patriot - Early Season, Very cold hardy and tolerant of wet soil. Very showy white blooms with flavorful fruit. Enjoy the bright orange foliage display in the fall.



Bluecrop - Midseason, considered the best all around blueberry. Very large and extremely flavorful berries with a light blue color. Outstanding fresh or in the kitchen.

SPECIAL WILDLIFE ENHANCEMENT SPECIES



White Flowering Dogwood - 8 to 16" seedlings. An ornamental for all seasons. Small clusters of white flowers in spring, redish berries and red foliage in fall, bright red bark in winter. Grows well in wet conditions.

Forsythia - 1 year old seedlings, 20 to 40". Fast, upright growth to 7 feet. Tolerates poor soil and city conditions. Good for screens and hedges and cover for birds and small wildlife.



Common Lilac - 12 to 24" seedlings. Produces extremely fragrant flowers in late spring. Good screen plant grows to 15' provides good cover for many birds

Winterberry Holly - 8-18" seedlings. Should plant several for pollination. Best plant for fall & winter yellow color. Female plant produces bright red berries. Height and spread 6-12'. Likes acid soil. Good wetland plant. Attracts winter song birds.



Red Bud - 10-24" Seedlings. Can grow to 20 or 30 ft tall with a profusion of purple blooms early in the spring before the leaves appear. Large heart shaped leaves turning bright yellow in the fall. Full sun to partial shade, tolerates wide range of soils.

Prairiefire Crabapple - 6-12" seedlings. Shrub growing to 20' with bright red to purple flowers. Small, dark red fruit with maroon to dark green foliage turning reddish purple in the fall.



Serviceberry - 12 to 18" seedlings. White early spring blossoms followed by purple edible fruit Provides cover and food for wildlife Yellow to red foliage on this small tree in the fall.
